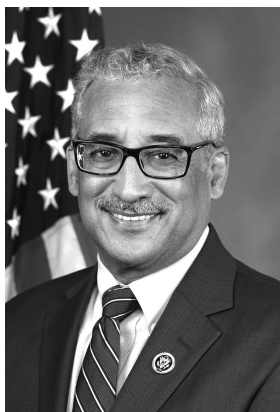

Commencement Speaker and Honorary Degree Recipient

CONGRESSMAN ROBERT C. “BOBBY” SCOTT

*Representative for Virginia’s 3rd Congressional District
Candidate for Doctor of Laws (honoris causa)*



Congressman Robert C. “Bobby” Scott has represented Virginia’s third congressional district in the U.S. House of Representatives since 1993. Prior to his service in Congress, he served 15 years in the Virginia General Assembly.

Congressman Scott currently serves as the Chairman of the Committee on Education and Labor. In this capacity, he is advancing an agenda that improves equity in education, frees students from the burdens of crippling debt, protects and expands access to affordable health care, ensures workers have a safe workplace where they can earn a living wage free from discrimination, and guarantees seniors have a secure and dignified retirement. In 2015, he was one of the four primary authors of the Every Student Succeeds Act, which reauthorized the Elementary and Secondary Education Act for the first time in 13 years and replaced the No Child Left Behind Act. He also serves on the Committee on the Budget where he is a leading voice on fiscal policy and reducing the deficit.

As a former member of the Committee on the Judiciary, he is a leading advocate for reforming our nation’s broken criminal justice system. He has successfully worked to pass bipartisan legislation to reduce mandatory minimum sentences, reform the juvenile justice system, and require reporting and federal data collection of deaths that occur in police custody, jails, and prisons.

Congressman Scott resides in Newport News, Virginia. He is a graduate of Harvard College and Boston College Law School. He also served in the Massachusetts National Guard and the United States Army Reserve.

Honorary Degree Recipient

DR. JAMES V. KOCH

*Board of Visitors Professor of Economics Emeritus and President Emeritus
at Old Dominion University, President Emeritus of the University of Montana,
Candidate for Doctor of Humane Letters (honoris causa)*



Dr. James V. Koch is Board of Visitors Professor of Economics Emeritus and President Emeritus at Old Dominion University. He has held positions at Illinois State University, California State University at Los Angeles, the University of Grenoble (France), Brown University, Rhode Island College, Ball State University, the University of Hawaii, the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology in Australia and the University of Montana. He served as President of the University of Montana (1986-1990) and Old Dominion University (1990-2001) and was named one of the 100 most effective college presidents in the United States.

Dr. Koch has published 12 books and 110 articles in refereed journals. His 1996 book *Presidential Leadership: Making a Difference* (co-authored with James L. Fisher) is used as a reference and textbook in many universities and leadership institutes. Other notable titles include *The Entrepreneurial College President*; *Born, Not Made: The Entrepreneurial Personality*; *The Impoverishment of the American College Student*; and *Runaway College Costs: How College Governing Boards Fail to Protect Their Students*.

For 18 years, Dr. Koch produced the widely cited State of the Region Report for the 1.7 million population Hampton Roads, Virginia, metropolitan area. Beginning in 2015, he began to produce a State of the Commonwealth Report that focuses on Virginia economic issues. He has also served as a consultant/expert witness for more than 100 legal firms, corporations, and universities, including Virginia Wesleyan University.

Dr. Koch has a B.A. from Illinois State University and a Ph.D. from Northwestern University.

Academic Regalia

The three academic degrees generally recognized are the bachelor's, master's and doctorate.

The name of each degree seems to have been determined by medieval custom. The bachelor's degree, the baccalaureate, takes its name from the practice of referring to novices in trade guilds, knightly orders and universities as "bachelors." The master's degree was equivalent to a license to teach, and sometimes was followed by the express words *licentia docendi*. The doctorate degree derived from the habit of addressing scholars of great learning by the title "doctor." Today, of course, all three degrees are generally earned by following a prescribed course of academic study.

However, honorary degrees are granted for meritorious service and for distinction in public or private endeavor. In the medieval university, students and teachers wore gowns indicating their status and scholastic achievement. In 1895, an intercollegiate commission drafted a uniform code governing the use of academic caps, gowns and hoods in the United States. The vast majority of colleges and universities in the nation, including Virginia Wesleyan University, adhere to those guidelines.

Those holding the bachelor's degree wear a black gown distinguished by long pointed sleeves hanging to the knees. The master's gown, worn open, features even longer sleeves which are closed at the bottom. There are slits about midway for the arms. The doctorate gown has full-length lapels of velvet and bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal velvet bars.

A hood may be worn with the gown and is made of the same material. Each hood is lined in silk with the colors of the institution which granted the degree. In the case of Virginia Wesleyan, for example, the colors are blue and white. The bachelor's hood is three feet long, with a two-inch strip of velvet. The master's hood is three and one-half feet long, faced with a three-inch velvet strip. The doctor's hood is four feet long, faced

with a five-inch strip of velvet. The color of the velvet strip on the hood indicates the field of study in which the University degree was earned or granted, for example:

Arts White	Public Health Salmon
Science Yellow	Fine Arts Brown
Music Pink	Education Light Blue
Social Welfare Citron	Business Drab
Theology Scarlet	Philosophy Blue

The appropriate cap for all degrees is the familiar "mortar board." A tassel, hanging to the left of the face, is also appropriate for all degrees. Holders of the doctoral degree may wear a soft velvet cap of the color indicating their field of study and a tassel of gold thread.

Gonfalons

Serving as the backdrop for the Virginia Wesleyan University Commencement Ceremony are the institutional banners, or gonfalons. The institutional gonfalon leads the procession, reflecting the University's rich history and commitment to liberal arts education. It is followed by banners for the Batten Honors College, the Birdsong School of Social Science, the Joan P. Brock School of Mathematics and Natural Sciences, the Susan S. Goode School of Arts and Humanities, the D. Henry Watts School of Professional Studies, and Virginia Wesleyan University Global Campus. Each contains imagery and colors signifying its respective area of discipline. The style of the gonfalons processing today was unveiled in 2017 with design by Christine Hall and hand stitching by McIlhenny Banners of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. They replace the University's original gonfalons, which were created and hand stitched by Judy Tinsley and Judy Coltrane, with additional design from the Art Department. The first set of gonfalons are preserved in the Office of Academic Affairs and remain an important visual tribute of Virginia Wesleyan history.

Presidential Medallion

A symbol of the Office of the President of Virginia Wesleyan University, the medallion was commissioned upon Virginia Wesleyan's transition from College to University status in 2017.

It features the official University seal and hangs on a cloth ribbon in VWU blue. The original sterling silver and blue enamel medallion (1993-2017) also utilized the University seal as its main design element.

Honorary Degrees

Doctor of Arts (*honoris causa*): This degree is awarded to individuals who have distinguished themselves in the Arts.

Doctor of Divinity (*honoris causa*): First awarded in 1786, this degree is awarded to individuals who have distinguished themselves in endeavors related to religion.

Doctor of Humane Letters (*honoris causa*): First awarded in the 1880s, this degree is awarded to individuals who have distinguished themselves in the humanities.

Doctor of Laws (*honoris causa*): First awarded in 1773, this degree is awarded to individuals who have distinguished themselves in general service to state, to learning and to mankind.

Ceremonial Mace

A mace, once designed for use as a tool of medieval warfare, has served in recent centuries as a symbol of authority and vitality by legislative bodies and institutions of higher education. In the latter context it becomes a ceremonial staff, bearing engraved images and words which represent distinguishing characteristics of the institution.

The Virginia Wesleyan University mace was created by goldsmith Suzannah Wagner of Ashland, Virginia. The cherry wood for the mace was harvested in southeastern Virginia in the 1930s and the base of the shaft contains grains of earth preserved from the original campus groundbreaking ceremony on July 18, 1965. Latin inscriptions on crystal panels evoke mind, body, spirit and community. Additional engravings on crystal and silver reflect agricultural, maritime and other regional symbols; the United Methodist cross and flame; and scenes of the campus.

The mace is carried in academic processions and at other times is displayed on the campus accompanied by a narrative describing the symbols which it bears.
