## ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Through the creation of the joint program in medicine, talented, qualified students at Virginia Wesleyan College may apply for admission to Eastern Virginia Medical School (EVMS) during the fall semester of their sophomore year.

Students selected for admission into this program are expected to complete a challenging academic program at Virginia Wesleyan and to obtain substantive exposure to the field of medicine as an undergraduate. Upon completion of a 4-year bachelor's degree at Virginia Wesleyan, students in the program are guaranteed admission in the Eastern Virginia Medical School.

**Be accepted to medical school during your sophomore year!**

## Admission Requirements

**SAT Score:** students must have a minimal score of 1250 to be considered for admission, with a score of at least 600 on both the critical reading and mathematics sections.

**Credits:** student must have completed at least 24 credit hours during their freshman year at Virginia Wesleyan.

**Continued Eligibility:** guaranteed admission is contingent on maintaining a 3.25 GPA overall and in the sciences.

## Applying to the Program

Prospective students must submit a letter of application to the Virginia Wesleyan pre-professional committee during the fall semester of their sophomore year.

A limited number of students (one or two) are selected each year by Virginia Wesleyan's pre-professional committee and the Eastern Virginia Medical School's Admissions Committee.
