
Scott Hinze had two articles come out. He was co-author of Fool me twice: The consequences of reading (and rereading) inaccurate information and lead author of Retrieval (sometimes) enhances learning: Performance pressure reduces the benefits of retrieval practice, both in Applied Cognitive Psychology, 28.

The first – "Ontogenetic investigation of underwater hearing capabilities of loggerhead sea turtles (Caretta caretta) using a dual testing approach" in *J Exp Biol.* 217 – was based on grant work done in collaboration with ODU.
