RECOMMENDED COURSES FOR MAJORS PLANNING TO TRANSFER TO VWU

Students planning to transfer from Thomas Nelson Community College to Virginia Wesleyan University should complete courses that will satisfy VWU's major requirements and facilitate timely degree completion. Courses in black are strongly recommended—students who do not complete these courses may require an additional year due to course sequencing issues. Courses in blue are encouraged—they would put students ahead by having additional courses completed toward the major.

Students who complete the Associate of Art or Associate of Science degree will satisfy all of the VWU general studies program except for the junior/senior seminar (Seminar 3).
